- Book private online meetings with university representatives;
- Attend online talks about the most important information about studying in the UK –

 about applying to the UK and advice on your first steps as a UK student;
- Find out newly released information from specific universities about scholarships for EU students, and the cost of studying in the UK;
- Get the latest information about visas and health insurance for EU students;
- Hear presentations by current students and alumni of UK universities from countries across Europe;
- Speak to British Council experts in online meetings;
- Get information about English language tests and requirements for UK universities.

Studying in the UK

The UK has a world-leading education sector and will continue to welcome talented and high potential international students. There are currently over 485,000 international students in the UK, and it remains the highest rated study abroad destination for quality of teaching and research among students from European countries (British Council research, 2020). Ninety per cent of international students say they are very satisfied with their UK education experience, and that they progressed more quickly in their careers after studying in the UK than their peers who studied abroad elsewhere.

The UK's Government is also making it easier for the best international graduates to secure skilled jobs in the UK with the new Graduate route, which will allow international students who have completed undergraduate and master's degrees in the UK to stay for two years and those who have completed a PhD to stay for three years. The Graduate route will open in summer 2021.

Many UK universities are also taking action to offer support to EU students. Several universities participating in the British Council's Study UK Europe: Gateway to the UK virtual event, open to European students between 19 October – 13 November, have published offers on their profiles on the event platform, including covering the costs of 'home fees' for EU domiciled students starting in 2021/2, offering specific EU scholarships for new EU students or extending existing scholarships to EU students.
